And despite all the importance of the station for the city, this station... is closed. Yes, the station building itself is nice, it is in good condition, the station is painted and...closed, you can't go inside. Estonian sur.. There are no complaints about the quality of the railway service, new and very comfortable Elron trains run from Tallinn to Paldiski and back every hour (travel time 1:14 minutes, ticket costs about 3 euros), but there should be a station in the city not nominally, but to actually act and the fact that it is closed is a shame for the Estonian railway and for the city too. The station definitely needs to be opened, at least just so that in winter passengers have the opportunity to wait out the bad weather and cold inside.

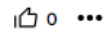

Beware of a danger /construction zone

Summer of 2022 until unknown time, the trail is cut in half by the construction site of a gas pipe, with no way to get around it! No warning signs at either end of the trail, no pointing signs where to go. The trail just ends suddenly with a sign: danger zone, do not enter. Especially uncomfortable if you approach it from the direction of Kloogaranna/Leetse - the trail is too long to go back, there is no public transport anywhere for miles... just a dead end. I missed the lighthouse and the great viewing platform at the tip of the peninsula. There was a pier with heavy machinery to my right and a giant cliff to my left, which I somehow managed to climb, but then ended up fenced in, in construction danger zone. Had to push through a very narrow gap in the fence, a heavier person could not get through for sure. No signs or notices anywhere about where you're supposed to go when meeting the construction zone.. ended up walking through the wind turbine park, which was several km wide. This was not something I planned to go and see.

Most of the trail is rugged sort of beautiful though. Once the pipeline has been finished, this trail is definitely worth visiting though. Another warning: do not try this trail with kids under 10 yo. The trail at the edge of the cliff is dangerous. Possible to take an alternate route on the mainland though, which is not marked however, possibility of getting lost

Depending on the size of the boat and the self-esteem of its owner. Nearby residents recommend taking your entire supply of drinking water with you. Although there is fresh water in small lakes. The islands are connected by a new pedestrian bridge, which offers a picturesque view. On the islands there are 2 churches, a large number of abandoned army buildings, and old Swedish villages. During Soviet times, the islands were used as a bombing range. Therefore, as sound advice, we can recommend making fires in the places of old fire pits.. :)

Today very little remains of that ugly, dilapidated building and many other Soviet military structures: they have been demolished or repurposed for other uses. The nuclear submarine base no longer exists. The red zone, or the promontory, is certainly the most interesting part to visit: it once hosted the most secret military installations. Today it offers a beautiful cliff, an excellent view of the sea, and the new wind farm. In the midst of the vegetation a watchtower and some buildings. You can only get there by car, from the station. Paldiski has been de-Sovietized and largely cleared, fortunately, also of the very dangerous nuclear waste.
